Chief Ken Chew and members of our fire department thank you for all you do, from entering burning dwellings, and assisting other towns. The weekly Tuesday night drill is proof that our fire fighters are the most trained and educated in New Jersey. We are safer knowing you are always there for the residents of Gibbstown.

We have many volunteer committees in Greenwich Township that assist in the day to day operation of the township. Their commitment and work put into all the activities they provide for our residents is much appreciated. I want to personally thank every volunteer for your commitment and dedication to your committee.

Business and Economic development is key to revitalizing our growth in Greenwich Township. We are contacted very often from businesses and developers showing real interest in locating to Gibbstown for various areas of business and development. The Economic Development coordinator and her committee are working steadfastly with potential developers, small business owners, and current business owners to support their needs. They are relentless in their pursuit of bringing new businesses to Gibbstown. The committee has held mixers with local businesses to keep the lines of communication open. We want everyone to know that Greenwich Township is "Open for Business".

Our third annual Gibbstown Day was a great success and the committee will continue to elevate the event to make it even better for 2024. The Recreation Committee will continue with the Easter Egg Hunt, the children's fishing contest, and the Halloween "Boo Bash" with Clonmell United Methodist Church. The recreation committee continued the youth kayaking lessons at Silvestro Lake. The third annual Gibbstown Bunny Run 5 k will be held on Saturday, March 30, 2024. The Bunny Run is quickly becoming one of the most popular Spring 5k races in South Jersey.

December was full of well attended events with our Special Events Committee Annual Tree Lighting and tree decorating contest. The Gibbstown Giving's Christmas Car Parade was excellent and enjoyed by our residents. The lighting of the new township Christmas tree in Memorial Park was enjoyed by everyone who attended.

The planning for the painting of the water tower is progressing. Painting the water tower is not as simple as hiring a painting company to paint the tower. The water tower must be emptied, and the township must ensure that water can be supplied to the entire township while the water tower is out of service. This job would have been a lot easier to complete if the smaller standpipe water tower was in service. In the Fall, Mayor and council approved the hiring of an inspection company to determine the best course of action for painting the large water tower and the standpipe tower. The goal is to have the standpipe in full service, then paint the large water tower, and then to paint the standpipe water tower.

In other news for 2023, the township lit the Softball Field at the North School Street Athletic Complex and installed new playground equipment.

We did not forget our older residents either. In the Fall, the township took ownership of a brand-new senior bus. This was made possible by a grant from the Gloucester County Capital Transit Investment Plan. In 2024 the bus will be in service.

The accomplishment that I'm most proud of is the fact that the township set goals and met goals without raising the municipal purpose tax. In fact, the municipal tax rate has gone down or stayed the same for the past three years. This could not have been done without the commitment of the department heads keeping their budget requests to a bare minimum. The last three

municipal budgets have been budgets of need not wants. I appreciate the hard work of our CFO Kelsey Santogrossi, township administrator Jeff Godfrey, and Budget Chairman Council President Joe DiMenna. I would also like to thank the township auditor Bowman & Company led by Mike Welding.

In an effort to ease the burden of the tax payers, Mayor and Council approved the hiring of Triad & Associates to assist in the procurement of county, state, and federal grants. As you know grant money doesn't need to be repaid. Triad is currently working on grants for open space, parks, the water tower and improvements to Memorial Park.

As Mayor, my first and most important responsibility is to serve the residents of Greenwich Township and to continue to improve the quality of life for them, with help from our local officials, as well as department heads and employees. Thank you to our Administrator, Jeff Godfrey and our office staff for keeping the day to day operations and serving our residents daily, a top priority. To our CFO Kelsey Santogrossi, and Township Clerk, Holly Tropea you've done a great job this past year, we appreciate your efforts.

The Municipal Clerk serves as Secretary of the Municipal Corporation and Secretary to the Governing Body. They maintain custody of all minutes, ordinances and resolutions of the municipality, as well as the Records Coordinator and Manager. The Municipal Clerk is the Administrative Officer. The clerk issues Social Affair Permits, Raffle and Bingo Licenses, Liquor Licenses and Assessment Search Certificates. Additionally, the Municipal Clerk manages Vacant and Abandoned Property Registrations in the Township.

Games of Chance:

Any organization interested in conducting games of chance must first apply to the Legalized Games of Chance Control Commission for eligibility. Only "qualified organizations" are eligible; meaning a bona fide organization or association of veterans, religious congregation, religious organization, charitable organization, educational organization, fraternal organization, civic and service club, officially recognized

volunteer fire company, officially recognized first aid squad and officially recognized rescue squad, and senior citizens' association or club. In order to conduct any game of chance, you must first register with and obtain an identification number from the LGCCC. (NJAC 13.1)

The Municipal Clerk is the Chief Administrative Officer of all Elections and Chief Registrar of Voters in the municipality. Our residents can obtain Voter Registration Forms, Vote-By-Mail Ballot Applications and Party Affiliation Declaration Forms from this office.

By joining this initiative, we are making it easier and more convenient than ever for Greenwich Township residents to take an active role in the fight against the nationwide epidemic of opiate and heroin abuse, which often is fueled by the abuse of prescription painkillers. Our department's new Project Medicine Drop box is located at Police Department Headquarters: 421 West Broad Street, Gibbstown. Residents may visit the station at any time, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year, to dispose of their unused or excess medications.

News from Anthony T. Calista Gibbstown VFW Post 5579




Greetings and Happy New Year Gibbstown!

Trash & Recycling

Trash Pickup

- Trash is collected Mon-Thurs (see below for your specific day)
- Cans should not weigh over 50 lbs
- Containers should be a maximum of 35 gallon capacity
- Cardboard should be recycled with the exception of pizza boxes or glued Styrofoam
- While we encourage mulching, grass clippings and yard debris such as leaves can be bagged
- Chipping debris such as small branches/limbs may be placed curbside and are picked up the 1st & 3rd week of the month

Fall Leaf Collection

Cans must not be larger than 35 gallons or weigh more than 50 pounds when loaded.

Latex Paint

Latex paint can be disposed of in the regular trash, after it is dried out by mixing with sand or kitty litter.

Solicitor's Prohibited Stickers

A reminder to our citizens. All persons wishing to solicit (i.e. selling goods from door to door) must first obtain a "Solicitor's Permit" from the Chief of Police. If a solicitor comes to your home you should ask to see their valid Permit to Solicit before conducting business with them. If they do not have a valid permit, you should decline their services. You can also call (856) 423-1900 and advise the dispatcher of the unpermitted solicitors in the area. If you do not wish for solicitors to come to your home, then you can pick up a "Solicitor's Prohibited" sticker at the Police Station and place it in a viewable area by your entrance door.

Chapter 578

SOLICITING AND CANVASSING

578-2. License and compliance required.

It shall be unlawful for any peddler, solicitor, vendor or transient

merchant to do business within the Township of Greenwich without first obtaining a license from the Township. It shall also be unlawful to sell or dispose of, or offer to sell or dispose of, any merchandise or services to be rendered in the future or to take orders for any merchandise or services to be delivered in the future, within the Township of Greenwich, except during the hours of 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday, local time. No one shall be permitted to solicit or canvass on Sunday.



Code Enforcement

Friendly Reminder - Maintain Your Property

Your home adds to the beauty of the community, so make the area around it as welcoming as possible by filling pots with flowers and keeping the grass cut and bushes trimmed. In addition, offer to help others with their yards who may not have the resources or ability to do so.

The Township of Greenwich has established ordinances and codes concerning property maintenance of all properties within the township.

Chapter 242. Brush, Weeds, Snow and Ice

242-1. Removal of snow, grass and weeds.

The owner or tenant of any lands abutting upon the public highways of Greenwich Township shall remove all snow and ice from the sidewalks and to the width of one foot out to the gutters in front of their said lands within 12 hours of daylight after the same shall fall or be formed thereon, and shall remove all grass, weeds and impediments there from within three days after notice to remove the same.

242-2. Prohibition of obnoxious growths or substances.

[Amended 4-2-1990 by Ord. No. 4-1990; 11-4-2002 by Ord. No. 26-2002; 12-7-2009 by Ord. No. 28-2009]

A. No person, including any individual, firm, partnership, association, company, organization or corporation of any kind owning or renting property within the Township of Greenwich, shall permit brush, weeds, dead or dying trees, stumps, roots, obnoxious growths, including tall uncultivated grass and weeds, vegetation, filth, garbage, trash or debris to exist on any real property within the Township of Greenwich.

B. All lawns, hedges, shrubs, bushes, weeds and growth or vegetation or any kind shall be kept trimmed and shall not be permitted to become overgrown, and no grass or weeds shall be permitted to grow to a height in excess of six inches.

IPMC Code.

302.4 Weeds. All premises and exterior property shall be maintained free from weeds or plant growths in excess of six (6) inches. All noxious weeds shall be prohibited. Weeds shall be defined as all grasses, annual plants and vegetation, other than trees or shrubs provided; however, this term shall not include cultivated flowers and gardens.
